Although this is a Catholic Committee on Girl Scouting Award, everyone (regardless of faith) is encouraged to earn this award and learn about St. Anthony.



Saint Anthony, perfect imitator of Jesus, who received from God the special power of restoring lost things, grant that I may find (mention your petition) which has been lost. As least restore to me peace and tranquility of mind, the loss of which has afflicted me even more than my material loss.

To this favor I ask another of you: that I may always remain in possession of the true good that is God. Let me rather lose all things than lose God, my supreme good. Let me never suffer the loss of my greatest treasure, eternal life with God. Amen.

Who is Saint Anthony de Padua?

Saint Anthony de Padua is a patron saint of **lost items**. He was born on **August 15, 1195**; his feast day is **June 13**; he was born and raised by a wealthy family in **Lisbon, Portugal**. His birth name was **Fernando Martins de Bulhões**.

Saint Anthony's name was changed when he was admitted to the new Franciscan Order. Saint Anthony de Padua joined the Franciscan Order because he was inspired by the beliefs and lifestyle of devoting their lives to God, after witnessing their martyrdom.

"Saint Anthony's bread" refers to a favor received by a mother of a girl named Louise Bouffier, who almost drowned in a well. The mother promised loaves of bread for the poor in exchange for Saint Anthony's help. Saint Anthony decided to help, and the daughter survived. The mother kept her promise and opened a shop devoted to bread for the poor. The shop was a center for the poor, thanks to St. Anthony de Padua.

The City of San Antonio is named after Saint Anthony de Padua because **Spanish** missionaries arrived and claimed the San Antonio land on June 13, 1718. As this was St. Anthony's feast day, they named the city "San Antonio." There is a large statue of him on the RiverWalk as well as one in front of the San Fernando Cathedral.

Saint Antony is often pictured with a lily because it represents his **purity and his lifelong struggle against the devil.** Baby Jesus is often pictured with Saint Anthony because it **represents purity** as well.

St. Anthony died in **Padua, Italy on June 13, 1231** and was buried at the **Basilica of Saint Anthony**. **Pope Gregory IX** canonized Saint Anthony de Padua on **May 30, 1232** at **Spoleto, Italy**.

Some of St. Anthony's Miracles:

Miracle of the Usurer-

The 13th century made a big difference in the economy of Europe. Before this time, most people were farmers and their lives revolved around their agriculture. Each farming village was generally governed and traded among themselves, because interaction with other villages tended to be risky. The dawn of the Middle Ages and Crusades changed this. Slowly people began to interact with farther and farther away places and to depend more and more on goods brought from outside of their limited villages. As trade developed, the cities grew, and an economy was soon developed and created. Along with trade and currency, there was also a growth of "unfair" business practices, like debtors' prisons. Anthony, like the other friars, announced that they did not care for these new practices. They condemned them. Once Anthony preached at the funeral of a money lender. He told his listeners that they should not bury his body in the ground, for his soul was already in hell. He said that the man's heart was no longer in his body, but that the Gospel had been fulfilled, "For where your treasure is, there will be your heart (Mt 6,21; Lk 12,34). They opened the man's side and found that his heart was missing, but they found it when they opened up his treasure chest.

Miracle of Tommy & St. Anthony's Bread-

Tommy was a 20-month-old boy who lived with his parents near the Basilica in Padua. His mother had left him playing in the kitchen, where there was a large pot on the fire with boiling water in it. The little boy took a stool and started to peep into pot. He saw his own reflection and wanted to touch it, but in doing so he fell into the boiling water. Immediately afterward, the mother was back, and when she saw Tommy's feet sticking up out of the pot, she run to pull him out, but the boy was already dead.

The poor mother's screams roused the whole neighborhood, and soon a crowd had gathered at the house, including some friars from the Basilica. Seeing the friars, the woman was reminded of the wonderful miracles done by St. Anthony, and began to pray loudly for his help, promising to donate her child's weight in bread to the poor if he were restored to life. While the mother was still praying, Tommy arose as if from a deep sleep.

The miracle of the little boy who was brought back to life gave rise to the much beloved pious practice of giving bread to the poor as a petition or in gratitude for favors received through St. Anthony's intercession. Today, bread isn't as important in our diet as it used to be in ancient times, so now the friars of the Basilica of St. Anthony in Padua encourage the faithful to participate in this beloved tradition by giving alms to the poor.

Miracle of the Fish-

Once, Anthony had travelled to the city of Rimini because it was a full of heresy. The city leaders had ordered everyone to ignore him, so no one turned up for his speeches and homilies. Wherever Anthony went, no one welcomed him.

Anthony walked along praying and reflecting upon what had happened. As he walked outside of the town, he came to the mouth of the Marecchia River where it flows into the Adriatic. There he began to address the crowds: full of fish — not people.

He announced, "You, fish of the river and sea, listen to the Word of God because the heretics do not wish to hear it." Suddenly, the river filled with fish, pushing their heads out of the water, seemingly truly listening.

The people of Rimini, witnessing the miracle, came to the river to listen to Anthony. What began with a bit of curiosity for an amazing event turned into a piqued interest and open hearts to what Anthony was saying. They were so touched by Anthony's words that they abandoned their dislike and hardened hearts to return to the Church.

The Miracle of the Baby Jesus-

By 1231, all of Anthony's travels and illnesses he had throughout his life had weakened him. Anthony was suffering from dropsy, an illness that sapped him of his energy. During Lent of 1231 he spoke to always increasing crowds in Padua, but his preaching and the endless hours of confessions left him weak. Around this time, Anthony had been having a feeling that something bad was going to happen--perhaps a feeling of his approaching death. The friars and Count Tiso told Anthony to go to a hermitage in Camposampiero, a town not far from Padua, so that he may regain some of his energy. Tiso had been one of the "unfair" politicians seen in the "The Miracle of the Usurer, but after hearing Anthony preach, he had changed his beliefs and donated the plot of land of the town to the friars upon which the hermitage at Camposampiero was built. The weather was damp at this time of year, and it triggered Anthony's illness, just like pollen or mold can trigger someone's allergies. This conflict was solved when the friars noticed Anthony admire a large walnut tree on the property. They told Tiso about it, and he had a small tree house built in the walnut tree for Anthony.

One time, Count Tiso was passing by Anthony's room when a powerful light attracted him. At first, he thought that it was a fire, and so he ran into the room, alarmed and concerned. There he saw Anthony jovially embracing the Baby Jesus. Anthony asked Tiso not to tell anyone about what he had seen, and Tiso respected the Saint's wishes until after his death.




